Develop and implement a protocol or programme for education and self-management for minor ailments. The package is aimed to support the practice to develop and implement a programme of education for staff and patients with a focus on self-management and use of other clinics e.g. minor ailments scheme.

Practice meeting held on 7 May 2014 to discuss this new service for our patients. We sourced an up-to-date list of conditions currently covered by the minor ailments scheme via our 3 local pharmacists. Posters in both waiting areas, reception area and receptionists updated on what is available and to encourage patients to make use of this service as no prescription is required. Educate staff and patients about the appropriate use of minor ailments scheme, minor injuries units and emergency / A+E departments. Update practice leaflet, practice website with information re: the above services. Signpost patients to the most appropriate health care professional to deal with their problem / condition. Increase patient awareness by referring suitable patients to minor ailments should improve management of workload in the practice. Reduce in acute prescriptions for conditions covered by minor ailments scheme. Practice leaflet updated to include demand management – education & self-management.

Minor Ailments – why wait? To straight to your Pharmacist – conditions covered:

Out of hours

GP out of hours is available if you require **URGENT** medical care when your GP surgery is closed. GP out of hours services operate from 6pm – 8.30am. **Remember to telephone the service first 028 71865195.** The doctor or nurse will give you advice over the telephone, decide if you need to be seen by a doctor or will refer you to another service if required.
